BOATING TIPS

Being an active member of the local Royal Volunteer Coastal Patrol I go out on a wide variety of "assists" to vessels in trouble. One of the most common is to vessels that have ran aground. However in many cases where a vessel is only lightly stranded there are steps that can be taken by the master and the crew to possibly get off under their own power, these being:

Immediate actions

- 1. Do not apply power and try to push your way across, you will only put your vessel harder aground.
- Do not shift immediately into reverse and increase engine power, you may suck up mud and sand and possibly damage your engine not to mention the propellers.

 Instead

Assess the situation, is there any structural damage, is the vessel taking on water, what is the state of the tide, where is deeper water and if on rocks remember the rocks you are sitting on may be the only thing keeping you afloat.

Once you are satisfied there is no damage and you are not taken on water then some possibilities for getting off are:

3. Reduce draft, or in simple terms reduce the weight in the vessel, drain your live bait tank, place heavy items in your dinghy (if you have one) etc.

- 4. If on a yacht try putting a bucket of water out on the end of the boom and all aboard move to the side you have swung the boom, often this action is enough to heel the vessel over and swing the keel out of the sand.
- 5. Put out the anchor in the direction you wish to move, this can be done by taking the anchor out in the dinghy or by floating it out on life jackets, then set the anchor and use the winches or hand power to pull the vessel off (this process is known as kedging).
- 6. Use the tide, obviously if it is low tide it may only be a matter of waiting until the high tide arrives and you can float yourself off.
- 7. Use the wake of a nearby vessel to break the suction with the bottom.

If all these moves are not successful or you have any concerns do not hesitate to get on the radio and call Coastal Patrol for assistance.

Feeding Ducks Creates A Health Hazard

We have discussed with National Parks and Wildlife officers the duck population as well as the bad practice of well meaning people feeding bread to the ducks.

Firstly it is bad for the ducks. Bread is not in their natural diet and results in bacteria forming causing gut problems and infections. This often results in weaker ducklings with a shortened life span. You may see a group of 6 or 8 paddle by and a few days later reduced to 3 or 4.

Apart from being unhealthy for the ducks feeding distracts them from their natural habitat where they can forage in the wetlands. If they become resident on the Island, the result is nuisance night noise, offensive infected mess around paths, patios and pool surrounds. Mess in the pools can lead to ear nose and throat complaints.

Feeding of the ducks and birds has led to the unwanted black/brown Indian Myna birds that kill our lovely native birds.
