The continuing saga of the canals of St Huberts Island

Council Subcommittee formed

Gosford City Council in their wisdom have set up a subcommittee to investigate the waterways of St Huberts Island. By the time of the December General Meeting of the Association there will have been two meetings of that subcommittee.

Prior to the final deliberations of the subcommittee there are some matters residents should know.

- * Seagrass beds in the waterways are protected and it is an offence to dig and/or destroy them;
- * The foreshores of Brisbane Water including St Huberts Island are a potential source of acid sulphate soils which could be a danger if exposed to the atmosphere;
- * Any non-approved excavation in the area of beaches below mean high water mark could lead to prosecution;
- * Residents are advised that there is no danger in the clearing of sand from any boat ramp which exists in the waterways.

Boating in the canals - Pontoons

After five years since the St Huberts Island Drainage Reserves Task Group report, council has finally acknowledged that what has been done in the ensuing years has been to no avail and a new Local Environmental Plan (LEP) is to be prepared for the canals of the island - hope it doesn't take another five years!

Sand Reclamation

Much has been done to assist those residents and the contractor threatened with prosecution for this activity. There is no finalisation of the matter and residents should be cautious in their activities to protect their sea-wall and property.

Hopefully there will be more to report at the General Meeting to be held at Peridon Village Hall - 12th December.


