St Huberts needs more Committee members...



St Huberts Island - Plan of Management prepared by GHD Consultants

Thank you for your email of 10 October 2018 and your request for specific information relating to the Plan of Management (POM) which had been omitted from an email issued to you by Council on 9 October 2018. The Mayor has taken a keen interest is this matter and has referred this to me to respond on her behalf.

The following information addresses the issues raised at the meeting on 3 July 2018, in particular, the POM prepared by GHD Consultants.

- The preparation of the Draft "St Huberts Island Canals Guidelines for Management" document was commissioned by Council's Roads Traffic & Drainage (RTD) Unit in response to a list of questions raised by the St Huberts Island Residents Association. RTD has traditionally been considered the asset owner of the canals, as these are Council owned drainage reserves.
- In the last year this responsibility for management of the canals has passed on to the Waterways and Coastal Protection Unit. During that time, Waterways and Coastal Protection Unit staff have met with representatives from the Resident's Association on three occasions. I note that the Resident's Association has also taken the opportunity to contact myself and the local MP.
- The bed of the canals is Council owned land rather than a Crown waterway. The private boat ramps, jetties and beach areas fronting on to the canals are therefore on Council land. The seawalls in front of each property are behind the property line and are therefore on private land.

Justices of the Peace on St Huberts Island



Firstly, I cannot list Island JPs here. I was writing an article listing JPs on the Island for this newsletter when I discovered that legally I can't. All IP information is Commonwealth

copyrighted and basically it can't be reproduced by any means for any purpose.

But... I did discover two solutions to this conundrum...

1. There is an online JP Register

But importantly... your use of the Register is subject to accepting its Terms of Use.

- ♦ NSW JP Register: http://jp.lawlink.nsw.gov.au/public/welcomePublic.do#
 - Terms of Use: http://jp.lawlink.nsw.gov.au/public/Terms_of_Use.htm

There are several things to keep in mind after consulting the Register:

- * JPs on the Register are volunteers. They may not be available at short notice or at all times of the day.
- You must not use the information on the Register to send unsolicited communications, other than those necessary to enable you to make legitimate use of the JP services.
- When seeking the services of a JP, please telephone in advance to make an appointment. It is best to telephone during weekday business hours.

If urgent contact on a weekend is necessary, please limit your call to a reasonable time of the day.

When I was checking the list for Island JPs, I discovered the list is definitely **not up-to-date**: one JP I know left the Island several years ago, and another is deceased from last year.



2. There are NSW Justice Association staffed Community JP Desks

The NSW Justice Association staffs "Community JP Desks" throughout the State at a variety of locations. A detailed PDF list of Community Desks is at nswja.org.au/pdf/NSWJA JP Desks current.pdf and can be viewed or downloaded online from nswja.org.au/desks.html. The list is updated regularly as information changes, and is sorted by Postcode.

As at 29 October 2018, there are JP staffed desks at Kincumber Library on Fridays and Umina Beach Library on Wednesdays, but this could change, so consult the current JP Desks current PDF.



Your Neighbour's Trees!!

Other than the fence between neighbours, the next most concerning and vexatious issue between neighbours is the tree on a property boundary. Disputes are common, so just in case you weren't aware of the boundary tree issues, here is a brief (layman's) summary.

* There is a Trees Act - Trees (Disputes Between Neighbours) Act 2006.

* Common law allows a neighbour to prune the branches to abate the nuisance caused by the overhanging tree, without needing the tree owner's permission. It is advisable to notify the neighbour by dropping them a note setting out what you intend to do, why and when. Council permission may be required if pruning too much - typically between 10% and 33% depending on the Council.

* Mediation is a good starting point for disputes. Community Justice Centres offer a free service.

* If a dispute reaches the Land and Environment Court, it will not make an order if neighbours have not tried to reach an agreement. Usually parties pay their own costs, although costs can be awarded.

* The Land and Environment Court rules on -

- tree branches overhanging
- injury to a person as a 7
- result of a tree roots grown onto a neighbour's property
- high hedges blocking sunlight or views from a neighbour's property.

* Ultimately, the cheapest and quickest method to resolve a dispute is for neighbours to agree between themselves and approach Council for approval of the pruning or removing of the tree.
