Neighbourhood Watch

Our Neighbourhood Watch Co-ordinator has informed us of a change to reporting of crime statistics by the Brisbane Water Police District. This will be LAST regular Neighbourhood Watch Report unless there has been an increase or spike in offences on the Island. Targeted offences will include property crime such as: steal from motor vehicle, steal motor vehicle, break and enter, stealing and malicious damage.

Police cannot act when they are not informed of criminal activity. If not an emergency, and to ensure meaningful reporting, use the Police Assistance Line or Crime Stoppers phone numbers below, not local police stations who do not record phone conversations.

The report will be passed on to police in the same way as phone reports to the Police Assistance Line.

Outside there is a good swell and at times the current strong which makes outside catches difficult. A few bonito and kingfish are being taken in the Broken Bay area looking for baitfish.


Brisbane Water is producing flathead and bream at the usual hotspots such as The Rip bridge area and Half Tide Rocks.

The most common wild duck on the Island is the Mallard. They should eat a variety of foods including - a mix of plants and seeds, insects, worms, snails and crustaceans. This variety provides all or most of the nutrients they need for a healthy life.

BUT... most people feed ducks bread - easy to get hold of, cheap, and the ducks love it. Bread is bad for ducks. It offers calories but few of the nutrients ducks need. Eating bread (particularly white bread that has even less nutrients) fills them up so they don't go looking for "natural" foods. Health issues then kick in - obesity, malnutrition and a possible crippling condition known as "angel wing". This is a deformity in which the wings jut out instead of folding up and often making flight impossible. And

of course, ducklings will learn from an early age, and from their mother, to just wait and beg for bread and not even search out natural foods.

Mouldy bread can lie around to be eaten later. Spoiled bread can be potentially fatal. Some mould can cause specific diseases in ducks, lung disease being one of the most common.

Boston Baked Beans

Note: Beans need to be soaked overnight

- 2 cups of navy, white or borlotti beans
- 250g bacon (your butcher should be able to provide you with offcuts)
- 2 onions finely diced
- 3 tablespoon molasses
- 2 teaspoon salt
- 1/4 teaspoon ground black pepper
- 1/4 teaspoon dry mustard
- 1/2 cup tomato sauce
- 1 tablespoon Worcestershire sauce
- 1/4 cup brown sugar

Method:

- Soak beans overnight in cold water.
- Simmer beans in the same water until tender, approximately 1-2 hours. (OR put them in a pressure cooker with water for approximately 40 minutes)
- Drain and reserve liquid.
- 4. Arrange beans in casserole dish then alternate them with layers of bacon and onion.
- In a saucepan, combine molasses, salt, pepper, dry mustard, tomato sauce, Worcestershire and brown
- 6. Bring the mixture to a boil and pour over beans. Pour in just enough of the reserved bean mixture to cover the beans. Retain any left-over liquid for possible use later.
- Cover the dish with a Alfoil.
- Bake for 3-4 hours at 165 deg C conventional. (I actually put it in the oven at 95 degrees for 8 hours)
- 9. Check to ensure beans haven't dried out in the oven. Add more reserve liquid if required.

Take out of the oven and serve up as **Boston Baked Beans.**



WARNING - boats and their trailers being impounded

For the benefit of all Islanders, following is a repeat of an item from a 2016 edition of The Island

Boats on their trailers appear to be clogging up many a street in NSW. So much so that the NSW Government has now acted. Until recently only illegally parked or abandoned trailers (with their boats on board) could be removed or impounded.

However from August 2015, any boat trailer - whether registered or not - that is parked on the street must be moved within three months or it will be impounded.

As the Sydney Morning Herald noted in their August 4 2015 article...

"Consider a fisherman who goes fishing at 3am in the morning and comes back at 2pm in the afternoon and probably puts the trailer back into the same

He is using that boat every fortnight but as far as council officers are concerned it has been there the whole time."

OPTUS 5G Internet on St. Huberts (soon...)

The battle for 5G mobile phone data technology enters a new phase. While Telstra are concentrating on marketing 5G handsets and REALLY FAST mobile data, Optus are aiming their efforts at households, providing a possible alternative to the NBN.

They have recently announced Home Broadband plans from \$70 for unlimited data at 50Mbps 'Satisfaction Guaranteed'.

The issue is, it's new technology, expensive to roll out, and is attached to current or new mobile phone towers, and future 5G connected homes need to be very close to their 5G phone tower.

So... Optus are setting up (trialing?) 5G home broadband at 48 sites around the country by March 2019.

St Huberts Island is one of these sites, as is Daleys Point - or at least parts of these suburbs!

If interested you need to register with Optus at https://www.optus.com.au/shop/ broadband/5g. The significant part of your registration is your address on St Huberts... this accounts for your satisfactory access to

our 5G mobile phone tower (which I think is on the north side of Blackwall Mountain at the water tank).

While 5G is a massive leap forward in mobile data technology, it is still subject to same old problems of mobile data usage, but particularly:

* distance from device to mobile tower is significant (much closer for 5G)

- * more smaller phone towers (on buildings and poles) to account for smaller distances
- * multiple antennas at each location (5G millimetre waves have more bandwidth)
- * weather conditions (rain) may well affect 5G signal loss (5G millimetre waves are absorbed by atmospheric gases)
- * 5G doesn't like going through solids 5G modem position in your home could be significant
- * while tower congestion due to many connections and data passing through have been solved by 5G, the connection from the



tower to the Internet is a weak link - susceptible to congestion until upgraded. To use Optus' 5G internet, you will need/get a 5G modem (basically a mobile phone without voice capabilities) with a WiFi router built in to use WiFi around your home, and ethernet cable capabilities.
