

Increased Crime - Neighbourhood Watch

There are now no monthly reporting of crime statistics by the Brisbane Water Police District. They will only notify our Neighbourhood Watch Co-ordinator if there has been an increase or spike in offences on the Island, particularly property crime.

Police cannot act when they are not informed of criminal activity. If not an emergency, and to ensure meaningful reporting, use the Police Assistance Line or Crime Stoppers phone numbers below, not local police stations who do not record phone conversations.

We have been notified that on the Island:

- → There has been an increase in Break & Enter there were two reported in April
- ➡ We should secure our property when not at home.

There has also been stealing of and from cars in Umina - it is recommended unattended cars should be locked, even at home.

Report all crimes to the Police Assistance Line **131 444**, or Crime Stoppers **1800 333 000** if you wish to remain anonymous. If you prefer **internet** to phone, you can access www.police.nsw.gov.au, click on to the **NSW Police Force Community Portal** and complete a non-emergency **Online Police Reports** form. The report will be passed on to police in the same way as phone reports to the Police Assistance Line.

ESSENTIAL INFORMATION

Short-term Rental Accommodation on the Island

Following is an updated version of an article in the March 2018 The Island News.

The subsequent increased number of airBnB etc rentals on the Island, and the significant increase in noise and disruption from these houses has dictated a repeat of this article.

If you have been affected by an airbnb residence, pay particular note of point number 5 below.

With the rise in popularity of websites and apps such as airBnB and Stayz and the higher rental returns that such sites offer, many investment properties on the Island are increasingly being used as Short-term Rental Accommodation.

SHIRA has been contacted by residents regarding behavioural issues with some tenants at these properties. Issues such as foul language, noise problems, car parking congestion and excessive speed in canals and on our roads are some of the concerns that affect the amenity of nearby residents.

Listed below is the Central Coast Council guidelines that short-term rentals must comply with:

- ❖ The Central Coast Council uses the <u>Gosford Local Environmental Plan 2014</u> (last updated 28 February 2019) to define and control <u>short-term rental accommodation</u> when a 5-6 bedroom dwelling used as a temporary-use short-term rental accommodation requires development consent.
- Short-term rental accommodation is allowable under the <u>Gosford Local Environmental Plan 2014 Schedule 2</u> as Exempt Development, if the following five items are able to be complied with:



- 1. The subject dwelling must be located in a zone where dwellings are permitted with consent. (All Island homes comply with this.)
- 2. The dwelling must not contain more than 4 bedrooms.

(If 5-6 bedrooms, as above, it requires Development Consent with all the associated restrictions and requirements.)

3. The dwelling must be serviced by a general waste garbage bin of at least 240L capacity.

(Most residential dwellings are only serviced by a 120L bin. To comply with the LEP owners must pay additional rates for a larger bin.)

- 4. If the dwelling is located in a bush fire prone area, a bush fire evacuation plan must be attached to the dwelling in a prominent location.

 (This does not apply to Island residences.)
- 5. There must not have been more than 2 written complaints to the Council concerning the activities taking place on the property from the occupiers of separate dwellings located within 40 metres of the subject dwelling within the preceding 12 months.

(If Council receives 2 written complaints, in the timeframe noted, then the property is subjected to a DA application that will have more stringent conditions applied to the property.)

❖ Where the dwelling falls outside the criteria listed above, the owner should contact Central Coast Council's planning team (phone number below) to discuss the options that may be available with respect to their property.

Island Chef Recipe

Classic Lentil Burgers



Prep: 30 mins Cook: 15 mins Serving: 8 patties

Ingredients:

- ◆ 2 ½ cups cooked green lentils see Notes below for cooking
- ♦ 1 cup carrots, finely chopped
- ↑ 1 cup onion, finely chopped
- → 3 cloves garlic, minced
- ♦ 1/2 cup walnuts
- ♦ 1/2 cup sunflower seeds
- ♦ 1/2 cup flour (I used chickpea flour)
- ♦ 1 cup breadcrumbs, whole grain or gluten-free
- ◆ 2 eaas
- ♦ 2 tablespoons tomato paste
- ♦ 2 tablespoons Worcestershire sauce
- ◆ 1 tablespoon fresh or dried thyme
- ◆ 1 tablespoon fresh or dried oregano
- ♦ 1 teaspoon fine sea salt
- olive oil for cooking

Method:

- Using a food processor, finely chop the onion, carrots, garlic, walnuts and sunflower seeds then transfer to a large bowl. I process each ingredient individually to achieve the best texture.
- Next add half of the cooked lentils to the food processor and pulse until they appear slightly mashed, then transfer them to the bowl along with the remaining lentils.
- Once you have all the vegetables, lentils, nuts and seeds in the bowl, add the breadcrumbs, herbs, and salt.
- 4. In a small bowl, combine the beaten egg with the tomato paste and the Worcestershire. Pour the egg mixture into the bowl with vegetables and lentils and stir everything together. Sprinkle in the flour a little at a time as you continue to stir. If the mixture seems too wet, add more flour as needed. If you have time, refrigerating the mixture for about 30 minutes helps dry out some of the moisture.
- 5. Form eight individual patties with your hands, making sure to keep them somewhat flat with rounded edges. They will hold together better if they aren't too big or thick. At this point you can refrigerate them until you are ready to cook (for up to 2-3 days) or cook them right away.
- Use the olive oil to cook the burgers on each side for about 5-6 minutes.

Notes:


To cook 1 cup dry lentils: Soak them for at least 6 hours prior to cooking. This step helps aid digestion and will reduce bloating and gas. Drain and rinse the soaked lentils then add them to a pot with 2 cups water or vegetable broth. Bring to a boil, reduce to a simmer, cover half the pot with a lid and let simmer for about 30 minutes, or until the lentils are tender. Transfer to a strainer to remove excess liquid and allow to cool before putting them in the food processor.

If you can't find whole grain or gluten-free breadcrumbs, you can make your own by ripping up bread and processing to a crumb in the food processor.

Serve with:

Highly recommend: sliced red onion, dill pickles, mayo, and ketchup.
