

# ST HUBERTS ISLAND ENTRY STATEMENT



"Your committee has been working towards the beautification of the "Entry" to the island for some time now and with the support of Gosford City Council landscape architectural staff, a sample of the possible project will be open for inspection and discussion at the June General Meeting of the Association.

The proposal in brief is 'wall' or 'gates' type of entry at the foot of the bridge and finished in modern "graffiti-proof" masonry construction, followed by a row of well established "Cabbage" palms. It is intended to be a flow on type of entry from the foot of the bridge through the new area of decorative pavement, to a wall (gates effect) and on through a short avenue of palms (possibly 3 or 4 each side of the road).

As this project is only at a very preliminary stage there is a great deal of work and effort to be put into the proposal before it can become a reality. There is the need for public consultation, fund raising and the consideration of a development application.

From the point of view of funding it is not considered to be a 'rates' funded project and it will be financed from the St Huberts Island community and "Grants" funding from wherever and whenever possible." Report by Association President Ron Spratt.

Other issues discussed included a Safety Audit with respect to the Island bridge, boating facilities in the canals and the Island Triathlon.

It costs only \$5 per annum for a family membership which offsets the costs of general administration, hall hire, newsletters and various Island activities.
