Mooring Facilities in the Canals - report by our Preside , Ron Spratt

There has been considerable confusion and contrary comment in respect to the provision of mooring facilities in the canals of St Huberts Island. The major amount of confusion came out of a letter dated 28 February 2001 to all canal front residents in respect to the existing facilities and the necessity to lodge a development application.

On behalf of the association I have written to Gosford City Council requesting the Development Control Plan (DCP) be reconsidered, in particular, with reference to the requirements to share a pontoon between two properties, the necessity to enter into a caveat on the title where an approval is granted for a pontoon and the need for the lodgment of a development application for existing boat ramps which are seen to be in a good and serviceable condition.

Whilst being hopeful of an early and successful resolution to the request I am mindful of council's past dealings in this matter, however, whilst the authorization of existing pontoons or boat ramps will be necessary there is no urgent need for action to be taken at this time.

Vandalism

Although vandalism today appears to be a world-wide problem, other than some reported anti-social behaviour by hoodlums on the bridge and one or two recent incidents that the police are aware of, the Island remains relatively trouble free. Naturally residents do not want to see any of our young people in trouble with the police, so we would ask parents to be vigilant and explain to their children that bad company can lead to bad deeds. The likelihood of offenders being caught in the act is very real what with council rangers and off duty police officers watching trouble spots and Gosford Council's "Dob in a Vandal" reward scheme. The police advise that anyone witnessing any anti-social behaviour should neither approach the offenders nor the parents of offending youths, but should ring Woy Woy police on 4341 9122 or council rangers on 4325 8439 (office hours) or 4365 1393 (after hours).

Recycling News

The three-bin system continues to work well in making the Coast a 'greener' place to live, although you are reminded that polystyrene trays, clothes and plastic bags should not be placed in the yellow-top recycling bin. The need to have replaced our old bins has been questioned, but we are assured that they themselves will be recycled into new bins and I must say that our road sides do look 'smarter' now on collection days!

If the fault lays with the vacuum outlet it is a Council problem and it is against the law for a plumber to work on it. You should call Gosford Council on 4325 8446 during business hours or 4365 1593 on public holidays and after hours for all water emergencies and sewer problems.

Did you know?

Our Island, originally known as Bird, was first advertised for sale by the Government in the early 1830's. It was bought by Father Coghlan, a Brisbane Water District parish priest, who rowed a boat to his congregations. The purchase was completed in 1856. The proceeds of £154.10 shillings (being £1 per acre) were used by the Government to subsidise free and inexpensive migration. Land sales and subdivisions slowly continued over the ensuing century and in October 1961, St Huberts Island Pty. Ltd. purchased all the allotments and sections of the Island which were unsold at the time and when the only residents were said to be ". .a few fishermen and their families . .". A year after the opening of the Island bridge 30 years ago on 19th November, 1971 blocks doubled in price to \$9000 in just 6 months. With the opening of the Rip Bridge on 14th June, 1974 and the reliance on the ferry to get to Woy Woy station no longer necessary, land values continued to escalate up to today's incredible prices!
