NEIGHBOURHOOD WATCH IN ACTION

Thanks to the vigilance of an Island resident who alerted police to suspicious happenings at 2 am one morning in late January, a number of stolen items were recovered for their owners and the culprit is now doing time. This was one of several reported incidents over the last few months which has been one of the worst periods we have had for some years, even though our crime rate remains light compared with other local areas. Illegal Dumping Campaign

In an attempt to end the illegal dumping of green waste on the Central Coast, rangers have increased their surveillance and can issue on-the-spot fines of \$750 to offenders. The Waste Board may be contacted on 4323 4343.

The committee have submitted a list of items requiring attention including the Beachfront and Weatherly waterfronts, and outstanding kerb and guttering works. If all residents continue to keep their block aspects tidy and avoid hosing leaves into the gutter and drains, we can be justifiably proud of our little piece of paradise here on the Island.

Roundabout

It is hoped that Council will give the go ahead for works to proceed when they assess the report on the only tender received at their 28th March meeting.

Traffic Management

We understand that the implementation of 50 kph and signing plans will be carried out in conjunction with the completion of the top roundabout. You are also reminded that certain restrictions apply to car maintenance and parking on our roads.

Incident Reporting

Youths who put car and boat occupants as well as themselves in danger by jumping from bridges, even though it is prohibited, may be reported to the Police Action Line on 131444. A serious accident requiring hospital treatment has already occurred.

Federal Rotunda

A Development Application has been submitted to Council following community consultation and discussions with relevant Authorities regarding concerns raised. Taking these into account, the final modified design is an open structure together with landscaping, fixed tables and associated seating. We do not anticipate the rotunda will attract the attention of undesirable elements and the police have indicated they would co-operate to deter such activities. We are now awaiting Council's decision and if approval is given to proceed, it is anticipated that the area will greatly enhance Longarm Reserve, providing both an attractive focus for our Association to hold its annual outdoor functions and a pleasant place for residents to relax and enjoy the Island atmosphere.
