AROUND THE CANALS

The Central Coast Council contractor is contracted for eight days to clear all the drainage outlets prior to Christmas.

We have conducted several trials to clear the drainage outlets and restore sand back to the seawalls. We now have a good working relationship with Council, relevant management staff and the Council contractor (Australian Environmental Services), and we are all working on a four-year maintenance program to restore the island canals.

I will be holding an information forum for canal residents/members to show examples of different methods of restoring sand back to their seawalls and retaining it with sand or blue metal filled eco socks that will be included in the maintenance program.

The forum will be held on the easement between 40 and 42 Helmsman Blvd at 3pm Sunday 15th December.

BITING MIDGE

With many new residents on the Island, and approaching Summer, it is timely to cover the Biting Midge.

This class of minuscule flies, known in Australia as biting midges are about the size of a pin head, and often go unobserved. Biting midges are the smallest of the blood-sucking flies with an average lifespan of between a few days and several months. Small though a biting midge may be, it often swarms with its peers to become a formidable pest.



Biting midges thrive in coastal habitats such that which we enjoy here on

St Huberts Island. It is only the females that bite as they need blood to produce the next generation. The males feed on nectar. Victims are usually unaware of the fly's presence until it has already started to feed. The midge can inflict a bite that swells, blisters, or weeps with clear discharge. A bite can cause acute discomfort and irritation and, if scratched excessively and exposed to bacteria, it may become infected. In few cases bites may trigger an allergic reaction. Biting midges are not known to transmit any disease-causing pathogens to humans in Australia.

The University of Sydney tells us there are no known efficient methods of controlling biting midges, but personal protection will help in reducing exposure to their bites. Actively avoiding midge-infested sites serves practical as well as the use of an effective DEET repellent. However, a product called <u>Surefire Mosquito & Midge Slayer</u>, available from Coastal Rural Traders at Ourimbah, gives protection to an area when used as directed.

Treating and preventing midge bites

If you are bitten by a biting midge, it's important to treat the bite promptly. Follow these basic first aid steps:

- Apply a cold compress, such as an ice pack or a damp cloth, to the bite area to relieve any burning sensation. You can also use a Mentholatum rub or apply Eurax cream for added relief.
- Take an antihistamine to reduce swelling and itching.
- Avoid scratching the bite to prevent further irritation.
- If you notice any signs of an allergic reaction, call Triple Zero (000) immediately.

Australia Wide First Aid recommends taking the following precautions:

- Avoid going outdoors at dawn or at dusk, as midge bites occur most frequently during these periods in the day.
- Don't go about watering your plants at sunset, as the midges may be lurking under the cool and humid shade of your trees.
- Don protective clothing such as long-sleeved shirts with collars, trousers, and closed-toed shoes with socks when you go out in the early morning or late evening.
- Apply insect repellent formulated with 15% to 20% diethyltoluamide (DEET), focusing on sensitive areas such as your scalp, neck, and ankles. This will ward off midges as well as mosquitoes, ticks, and other biting bugs.
- Make sure you have good air circulation indoors; a competent ceiling or pedestal fan will suffice. Midges
 dislike the strong breeze and will stay away from it.





The story of the herd's rehabilitation, getting them to accept their new home and trust at least one human being was uplifting.

Our third book for this quarter was **Charlie Anderson's Theory of Lying** by Richard McHugh. The book could be confronting at times although most of us have met and known a person just like Charlie. He knew he was a good liar and was proud of his success at everything. Then things went wrong especially when he noticed his daughters maturing. Some of his outbursts/behaviours cost him dearly. VANDALISM

The following correspondence received from Council on 1 December 2024.

Central Coast Council is disappointed that the new fence at St Hubert Island Bridge has become a target for vandalism. Council is working closely with the Police to identify the individuals responsible and to ensure appropriate action is taken against them for damaging public infrastructure.

This fencing is in place to protect community members, and Council is exploring additional measures to ensure public safety and prevent further opportunities for damage. Council will keep the residents informed through active communication with the Local Resident Association.

Council also encourages residents who witness any anti-social behaviour near the bridge to contact the local police.
